There is a statewide census index for the Florida censuses of 1830, 1840, 1850 and I checked these books to see if any of your family names might be represented. In 1830 there were none of your family names(975.92xpa) In 1840 census index(975.9X2pa) there were no Turvin's at all but there were King families in Gadsden, Nass. and Jackson counties.

There was not time to look up the original census entries but they certainly might help in establishing a link from you to the earlier Ancestor who lived in Escambia. Please note on my map that I sketched for you that Escambia where Parobe and Jephtha Turvin lived is but two counties away from Walton county where a George and Elijah Turven are listed in the 1850 census. These names certainly fit in with the family given names that you gave me. Also the Samuel King in the 1850 census is in Gadsden, which is also a north western county.
