I typed this family up for you on a family sheet in my 13 Nov 1978 letter giving you a complete listing of sources that I had used. George W. found ~~found~~ with his parents in the 1870 census; He was found with his wife and children in 1880 and 1900 censuses A Descendant of Cally Turvin and Richard Owen Quincy joined the LDS church and their dates come from LDS church records; George W. is mentioned in a land deed wherein he gets land from Elija Turven (Turvin); You mentioned also where he is buried.

Because you have a death date on him I have ordered a death certificate for you on the chance that I might give more material on he and his wife and parentage than we have. See my last report. I have also ordered a marriage record for this couple.

I have searched all government census records from earliest to 1900 in Florida and Alabama in areas where your people lived. I have checked the statewide census indexes from 1820-1850 for Alabama, Georgia, and Florida.

In addition to the regular federal census I have done all the Special Indian censuses for the Seminole, Creek and this week I finished the Choctaw because I found mention of Red Shoes Being a Choctaw and traveling in the area of Pensacola.

I found out this week that Florida was considered part of the Miss. territory during the earliest times that Jephtha lived there. In the Book Mississippi Provincial archives pg 38

I found the following:

Three chiefs of Nation called Youghurs came to visit Lieut. Forde at Tombeckbe Fort 3 Dec 1763. The Principal chief was Red Shoes. They lived 100 miles west of fort at present and are at war with Chickasaws (Book 976.2N2m)

Please compare this note with the reference that I sent in my last letter about Red Shoes being a Chactaw (Choctaw)
